

## NZSI Annual Professional Development Points Chart

This Professional Development cycle starts on 1 January and ends 31 March 2026.

All teachers (all levels, accredited, in-training, provisional status and teacher trainers) need to acquire **100 points** by the end of each year to be eligible for Suzuki Teacher registration with the NZSI for the following year.

Within the 100-point total per year, a **minimum of 50 points** must be specific Suzuki professional development **from Table A**, including 25 points of instrument specific professional development per different discipline taught by the teacher. The remaining **50 points** can be made up of a variety of activities (see table B, C, and D).

If you have completed professional development that is not listed on here, please contact the Director of Teacher Training to see if your professional development can be approved.
